The Old Gal's Gardening Tips

- **Plant Spring bulbs now. To prevent squirrels digging up your freshly planted tulip bulbs, include some Acti-Sol in the hole and mix in with soil before planting bulbs. Sprinkle Acti-Sol on soil surface once you have completed planting. See package for additional information.
- **Don't cut back ornamental grasses or Echinacea (purple coneflower) in fall. Birds will enjoy foraging for seeds. Also, leaving some perennials standing creates winter interest in the garden.
- **Rake Leaves onto your gardens—shredded is best. Run over them with a lawnmower if possible.
- **Take tip cuttings now of pelargoniums (geraniums) or any other annual you especially enjoyed this year. Might not be available next year.
