August Design Demonstration

Our design demonstration by OHA judge Barbara Twiner and our own Pine Ridge Show Chair Norma Haney was a big success! While they created their designs, including a parallel design by Norma and several classic round designs by Barb, they provided tips as to what they were doing and why.

We learned about the elements of design: space, form, texture, line, colour, and pattern. We also learned the principles of design: balance, proportion, contrast, rhythm, scale and dominance. This information and more is available in the OJES book we sell for \$10—ask Norma or Libbi at the meeting.

Early feedback on this design demonstration was extremely positive, so we will plan something similar as part of our 2024 programs too.

Now it's time to take what you've learned, and try entering a design in the September 5 show. Categories include a vertical design, wayside design, harvest design with flowers, fruit and veg, and the novice category is a small design, maximum 10" in any direction.
