# Notice: Pine Ridge Name Change\*

We are planning to change the name of our garden club to Scugog Pine Ridge Garden Club (\*for marketing purposes only).

This will be an amendment to our constitution that is voted on by current members at our December 5 An-

nual General Meeting.

This name change will help us market the club as it's more descriptive and tells people where we meet (and garden). It will also help us avoid being confused (particularly online) with another Pine Ridge garden club that is in the U.S.

Our Club rules indicate Club members must receive 60 days notice before being asked to vote on changes to by-laws or the constitution.

For that reason, the name change was first introduced in the September-October newsletter and at the September club meeting.

### **Putting Your Gardens to Bed**

The inconsistent weather patterns make it hard to know when it's best to do your garden tasks.

- Dig up your summer bulbs and tubers canna, dahlias, gladiolas, etc. OR just leave them in the ground and treat yourself to new varieties next year!
- Rake your leaves onto your garden beds even better if you mulch them first
- Empty and take in your water barrels
- Get your tulips and daffodils in the ground cover with mesh to help deter squirrels
- Help prevent Oak Wilt by only pruning Oak trees between November and April.
