How to Divide Perennials

Many perennials benefit from being divided every few years, which is perfect timing for our upcoming plant sale! Dividing will keep plants from getting overcrowded and help them stay full. You may notice that some perennials add growth around the outside and die off in the middle – divide regularly to help avoid this.

Perennials that bloom later in the season are best for dividing in spring.

To divide a clump-forming plant, lift the whole plant by digging up as much of the root ball as possible. Gently remove enough soil from the roots so that you can see them, and pull or cut the clump apart into root pieces. Ideally you will have several growing points on each section. If you need to cut, use a sharp, clean garden knife or spade.

For plants that grow by runners or spreading roots, you can just dig up new, extra roots.

Place each plant for the sale in a pot, label it right away (before you forget) and keep it watered until delivering it. Preference is for plants to be delivered on Friday night, May 16, to Nestleton Community Centre, or at an early drop off location on May 15. This allows the plants team to get them organized for sale before Saturday morning.



If entering specimens in the Spring Flower Show, please be sure to place your entries in the correct class.



Large-cupped: the cup or corona is more than 1/3 but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (petals).

Small-cupped:- the cup is not more than 1/3 the size of the perianth.

Perennials especially those that are not usually easy to find at garden centres like astilbe, heuchera, echinacea, rudbeckia and groundcovers are always requested by shoppers.

So please, in the next couple weeks when you are working in your gardens, especially when dividing perennials, pot up several for the sale. See page 1 for instructions on how to divide a perennial plant.

Deliver your plant donations on Friday, May 16 at 7 p.m. at Nestleton Community Centre, or May 15 to one of these locations (plants only!): 51 Suggit Dr, Nestleton – on driveway or behind garage; 33 Ottawa St, Port Perry – on the front porch. If absolutely necessary, plants can be dropped off by 7:30 a.m. on Saturday, May 17 before the sale starts.

We also need volunteers to set-up and clean up afterward. Sign up at the May 6 meeting or contact a member of the Board.
